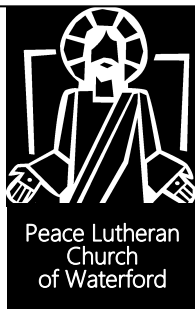

We will lift the mask restrictions at Peace the first weekend in July. We thank the Lord for His guidance and protection throughout these many months, and we look to the future with hope and thanksgiving. Our circuit sister congregations are planning a joint service of thanksgiving to our Lord for His protection throughout these trying months of dealing with COVID. We will gather on August 22 at 4:00 p.m. at Christ Lutheran Church in Milford. More information will follow as planning continues.

We will use our newest CEF grant money to secure unified WIFI availability within the church building with no need to log into a different WIFI connection as we move throughout the building. The grant money will help with this project.

Finally, as we emerge on the other side of this pandemic, we note that much has changed in our lives here at Peace. I hope that we return with a greater sense of the eternal hope in Christ that does not disappoint, for to know Jesus is to know forgiveness with an eternal hope that passes all human understanding.

**A SWEET TREAT**



Make this refreshing treat on a hot summer day.

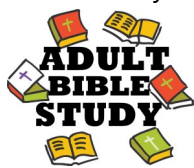
## Monthly Prayer Meeting

## Mask Policy Change

**From the President ~** Listed below are the dates and forthcoming changes for our COVID protocol:

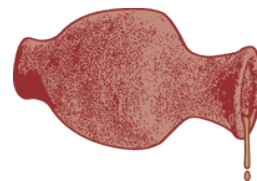


- May 15 — After service disinfectant discontinued
- May 22 — Hymnals and Bibles placed back in every row
- July 03 — Mask restrictions lifted—people can continue to wear a mask if they feel more comfortable doing so
- July 31 — Capacity restrictions lifted. All pews available but social distancing is still encouraged
- Sept. 04 — Holy Communion at the rail — begin passing offering plates through the pews

We will continue to livestream our Sunday services for those who cannot attend in person.

## ✝ Christian Symbol ✝

**OIL**—In the Old Testament, oil symbolized consecration to God. The temple altar and king's heads were anointed with oil to set them apart as holy. In the New Testament, oil often represented the Holy Spirit. Jesus and his followers were anointed for their ministries (see Luke 4:18 and Acts 10:38).

In *Keep a Quiet Heart*, Christian missionary Elisabeth Elliot ponders the faith implications of fretting about days to come. "Today is mine; tomorrow is none of my business," she writes. "If I peer anxiously into the fog of the future, I will strain my spiritual eyes so that I will not see clearly what is required of me now."

And what's the alternative? Instead of dwelling on times to come, which we can't change anyway, Elliot recommends: "Leave it all in the hands that were wounded for you." — Jesus!
