

Dear friends in Christ,

The sanctity of life is not a Liberal or Conservative issue for the church but a Biblical one.

I am compelled to speak to you about the issue of abortion and Proposal 3.

As you know, we live in a fallen world. Sin touches and permeates all that we are and do. Even the good we do is touched by it. Death came through sin and we all know how that affects us. We see death in ourdaily lives and we grieve the loss of those who are dear to us.

While we find ourselves today in a hard divide politically, our church body has a pro-life position because we believe that is what the scriptures teach. We hold to the sanctity of all human life and pray for those who hold different views looking to care for all who wrestle with the bondage of the sinful will that tempts us. From my view and the view of our church body - the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod - all life has value. Though we may be looked upon by others as a Conservative church body, we define ourselves as Confessional based on what we believe, teach, and confess.

The work of the church is to call all to repentance. To see sin for what it is and to turn from it. This call is to conservative and liberal alike. The Lutheran Church Missouri Synod is far from perfect, being made up of sinners, but we do hold the scriptures as the infallible word of God and our Lutheran Confessions as a clear and right exposition of the scriptures.

Those who wrestle with the desire to terminate a pregnancy need our prayers. There is no life without value and all deserve our care and compassion but no matter the circumstance, the killing of the unborn child is no answer for other wrongs.

The real dilemma is still: "Did God really say?"

At times as Christians, we want God's word to say that which is in accord with our feelings. We want God to speak how we think God should speak. But in a sin filled world we have to take God at his word, the only rule and norm for faith, doctrine and practice as our confessions declare.

Please prayerfully consider our Circuit Pastoral Letter enclosed in the newsletter and the information available from Right to Life Michigan and Lutherans for Life as you prepare to vote.

A Circuit joint prayer service is planned for Monday November 7 th at Faith Lutheran, Highland to lift our requests to the Lord in support of life. I urge you to attend and pray together for the defeat of Proposal 3.


